

ACCELERATED PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM (APHP)

ABOUT THE PROGRAM:

The APHP provides high-achieving undergraduate students the opportunity to earn their bachelor's and Master of Public Health (MPH) degrees in five years. Successful APHP students will have demonstrated commitment to the field of public health. Through their work within and beyond the classroom, they will be dedicated to understanding and promoting health equity.

The program was established through collaboration between Weinberg College's Program in Global Health Studies and Feinberg's Program in Public Health.



FEATURES OF THE APHP:

- Early acceptance into the MPH program at Northwestern's Feinberg School of Medicine
- Completion of the MPH in one year
- Exemption from the GRE requirement
- Up to three courses double-count toward a student's bachelor's and MPH degrees
- Ability to begin earning credit toward the MPH during a student's fourth undergraduate year at Northwestern
- Specialized advising before and during the MPH year
- Ability to pursue the generalist track or a concentration in global health, epidemiology, or community health research during the MPH year
- Opportunity to complete the MPH field experience abroad

READY TO APPLY?

Undergraduates apply for the APHP during the Winter Quarter of their third year of undergrad through CollegeNet. Students from any Northwestern school or major in possession of a 3.5 GPA are eligible. Before matriculating into the fifth year, students must have completed one human biology class and one statistics or mathematics class.
